“Which of you, if his son asks for bread, will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake? If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good things to those who ask Him!” (Matthew 7:9–11)

PRAYER POINTS — Let Us Pray for One Another

On this day, we will pray for the Church of the Lord Jesus and for its workers—both those serving in the churches to which we belong and those serving in other churches.

Let us pray that the Church will come out:

- of its lukewarm condition and spiritual numbness;
- of its inward focus—of worldly organization and operation—and allow the Holy Spirit to establish it in Christ, making it a living Body;
- into the communities where it is present and into the world:
 - to proclaim the Gospel;
 - to help those in need;
 - to prepare and support followers of Jesus who will serve in local leadership positions.

Let us pray that the Church and its leaders will:

- allow the Holy Spirit to remove “the world”—the spirit of worldliness—from the Church;
- allow the Holy Spirit to work as He desires: “the Holy Spirit together with us,” not “we together with the Holy Spirit”;
- allow the Holy Spirit to raise up and use young people and young couples in and through the Church;
- return to their first love;
- tear down and remove the idols from the life of the Church;
- break up new ground—a life lived in purity and holiness—and no longer sow among thorns: words that wound and destroy, sinful living, injustice, subjectivity, partiality, unforgiveness, and revenge;
- rebuild the holy altar of prayer in the Church and in the Body of Christ;
- choose to no longer waver between two ways: with one foot running after the world from Monday to Friday, and with the other walking in the way of the Lord only on Saturday, in preparation, and on Sunday, in ministry;
- return to preaching and living out the Word, rather than focusing only on denominational doctrines and theological theories;
- receive a vision from the Lord and everything necessary for its fulfilment.

Let us pray that the Lord will raise up people from among His people, appoint them for ministry, and use them with grace, power, and a living word:

- leaders who are equipped with spiritual gifts, wisdom, and understanding from the Holy Spirit;
- leaders who stand against the love of money, pride, and spiritual compromise, and who reject dishonest scales and unjust measures;
- leaders who will:
 - know the Lord Jesus;
 - have the Holy Spirit as their Partner in ministry;
 - care for the sheep and lambs of the flock;
 - be respected, appreciated, and supported.

May the Lord remember our prayers, the prayers of His flock. Amen!
